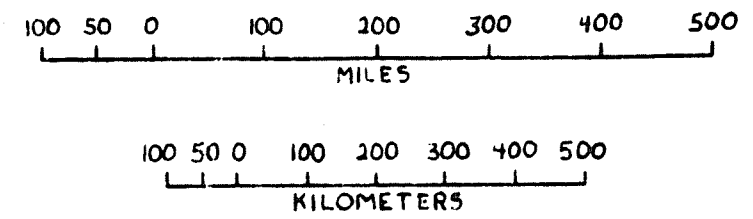

GENERAL INFORMATION

Date: Sinking date. Each tribe is shown where we have the first good description of its location. Many tribes listed have become extinct or have moved. Some others are known to be newcomers to the places where they are shown. Do not use this map uncritically. Broken lines separate tribes whose languages are supposed to be related. Relationship is not shown for the more doubtful cases. Shaded areas are presumed uninhabited. Languages of the same family or dialect names are shown. The general tribal name is written in capitals.
