Dear Armstrong:

I have just completed a paper entitled "Fourth World Wars...." for publication by the University of Toronto Press. I would like to share it with you and the other leadership of Aisuban Gasbya. My paper is a survey comparative piece on indigenous nationalist movements, and I have chosen to include the Miskito, Sumo and Rama nations as an example. While it is a small effort I am hopeful that this piece will help increase understanding of the context within which indigenous nationalist movements are increasingly active.

I would hope that Brooklyn and others could read the paper, because it could give them a better idea of the global challenge the Miskito, Sumo and Rama revolution represents. Besides, I would like them and you to know that I am still doing what I can to help. ---I have the Miskito, Sumo and Rama revolution close to my heart.

In response to the ILRC letter of November 3 concerning the aerial bombings of Aisuban Villages, I am sending personal letters to the Nicaraguan Embassy and government in Managua. I am also sending the same letter to the governments of the Contadora group and the InterAmerican Commission on Human Rights. I have also informed George Manuel and asked him to send letters.

I'm sorry I can't do more, but I will continue to do what I can.
