### Duties and Responsibilities of Executive Director

Executive Director shall, subject to the control of Employer, take full charge of the Employer's operations, exercise full supervision over its entire operation, including delegation of authority, and employ such help as may be necessary and desirable. Executive Director shall serve Employer diligently, faithfully and according to his best abilities in all respects, and generally do and perform all services, acts or things advisable to fulfill the duties of individuals occupying similar positions in similar businesses. In addition to the foregoing duties, Executive Director shall perform such duties as may be entrusted to, or imposed upon, him by the bylaws of Employer or by resolution of the Executive Board of the National Congress of American Indians. Executive Director shall have no right or authority, without the written consent or cosignature of the Chairperson of the Board, to make, enter into or execute, for or on behalf of Employer, program acceptances contracts or binding promises of any kind, whether written or oral, wherein the total financial commitment to Employer exceeds the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00). The Executive Director shall have full authority to employ staff as necessary and this authority shall not be subject to any other limitations imposed by these sections.
