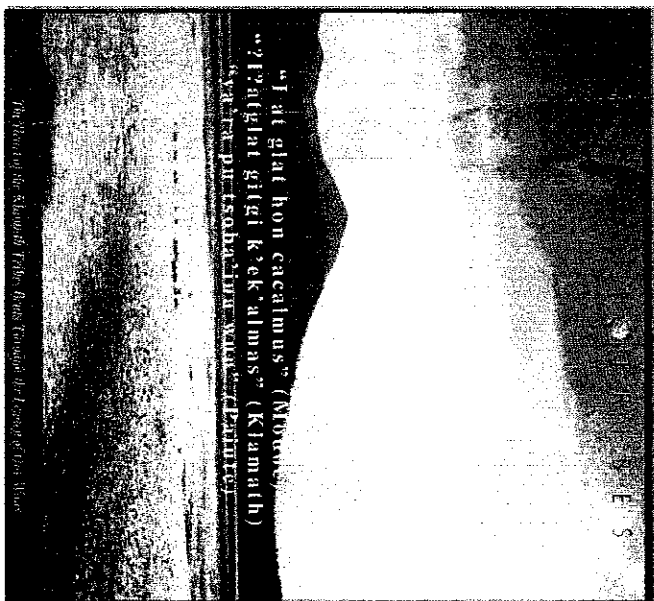

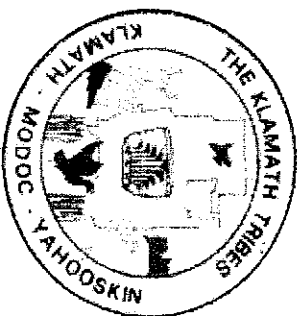

Dr. Duran has 20 years experience as a psychologist, professor, grant writer, conference organizer and administrator. He is the author of "Transforming the Soul Wound," "Native American Post-Colonial Psychology," "Healing PTSD Among Native Americans," and "Domestic Violence in Indian Country."

**Karina Walters, PhD,** (Choctaw) is an assistant professor at the School of Social Work at the University of Washington and principal investigator on several research projects.
