

The press specializes in publishing dissertations that exemplify qualitative research.</p> <p>To date, QIP has published 7 dissertations (revised to monograph form) and one training manual for qualitative researchers. The manual and 6 of the dissertation series are currently in print.</p> <p>These works can serve two roles: first, these books can serve as a model of how to conduct and write up a qualitative study, especially at the doctoral level. The dissertations have been from education, social sciences and health sciences disciplines, but their scope crosses boundaries to serve as exemplars for doing research in any field.</p> <p>Second, the content of these books is of interest and importance to healthcare and education practitioners and the public: dealing with grief after losing a child to AIDS, what is it like to be a teenage girl in the current school environment, how can low-income people group together to help themselves.</p> <p>The most recent publication is <u>The Wounds of Exclusion: Poverty, Women's Health, and Social Justice</u> by Colleen Reid. Dr. Reid is the winner of the first IIQM Dissertation Award, and this book is her dissertation.</p> <p>The dissertation award is an annual award, and we will publish the winner each year. The competition is open to doctoral graduates in all disciplines.
