FELLOWSHIPS

A limited number of Fellowships are available on-site in Mexico. A competitive application must be completed. Fellows are accepted to study and serve in areas such as traditional medicine, ethnobotany, traumatic stress studies, health education, tropical public health, anthropology, somatics, health psychology, politics, diplomacy, economics, environmental studies, tourism and development.

<u>Fellows</u> are doctoral candidates, post-doctoral or experienced professionals working in a relevant field. Fellows are expected to pay for and attend the first seminar and orientation week after which they undertake an original project which can be completed during the agreed upon term. Fellowships provide 25-40 hours a week in research and clinical/educational fields for a minimum of four weeks and a maximum of six months. Successful applicants are eligible to attend all seminars during their tenure and receive individual/group supervision from a primary faculty person. CWIS will provide documentation for credit required by the fellow's institution.

<u>Homestay:</u> Fellows live with a host family in the village and take most of their meals with their hosts and at Xipe Totec, unless other arrangements are made.

Application Requirements:

A successful applicant is resourceful, works hard, has skills to offer, is a relaxed participant in village life and is a serious learner who wishes to expand her/his potential. A successful fellow can expect to engage fully in village life, experiential and theoretical learning and gain experience living in a traditional culture undergoing change. S/he may also expect to benefit from participating in a community of international scholars, clinicians and activists and receive supervision from senior scholars/clinicians and expands her/his skills for a productive career.

Only complete applications will be considered. A complete application includes the following:

- 1. Completed and signed Application form (electronic or hard copy)
- 2. Two letters of reference
- 3. Curriculum Vitae
- 4. Application Fee (non-refundable, but applicable to payments if application is successful.)

Fellowship Fees and Expenses:

Fellows pay for one seminar in full, a one-time fee and toward the costs of housing and food. CWIS covers the costs of subsequent seminar tuition and supervision of research/clinical work.
