Thank you for your support and efforts in opposing Senate ratification of the California-Nevada Interstate Compact. The combined efforts of concerned people paid off.

Senator Evans, not only passively agreed to vote in favor of our position, but took an active stance, along with Senators Bradley and Cranston, and drafted and supported a favorable amendment to the bill.

Senator Gorton switched his position and supported the amendment presented by Evans, Bradley and Cranston.

Before the matter ever reached the floor for final vote, however, Senator Laxalt, realizing that it was hopeless, requested Senator Hatfield to move to present a motion to entirely delete Laxalt's amendment to the appropriations bill that called for ratification of the California-Nevada Interstate Compact. By unanimous vote, Laxalt's amendment was deleted and has been permanently put to rest.

The favorable resolution of this matter was of vital importance to the environment and the way of life of an entire tribe. Again, the Tribe and I wish to thank you for your help.


