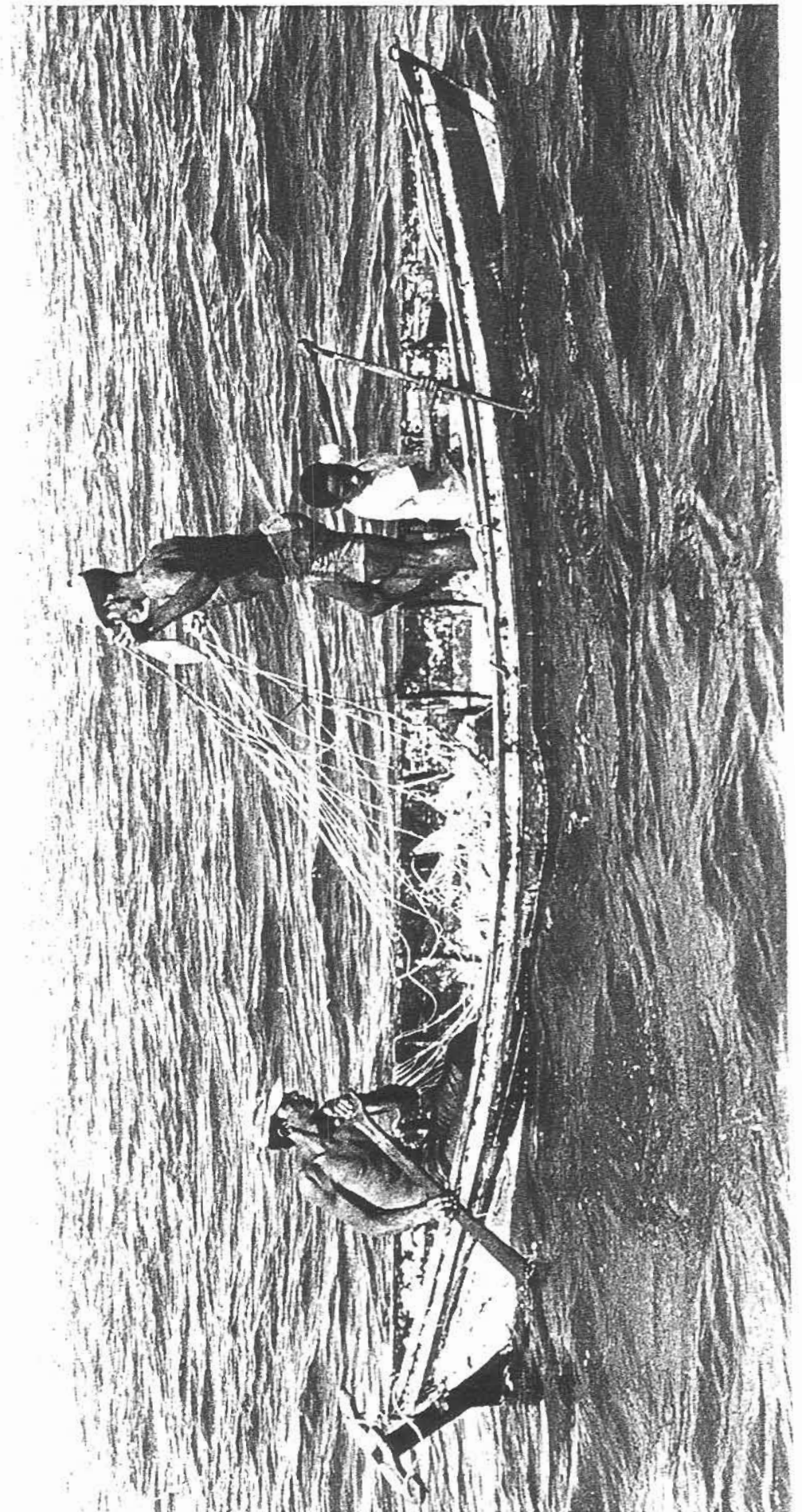

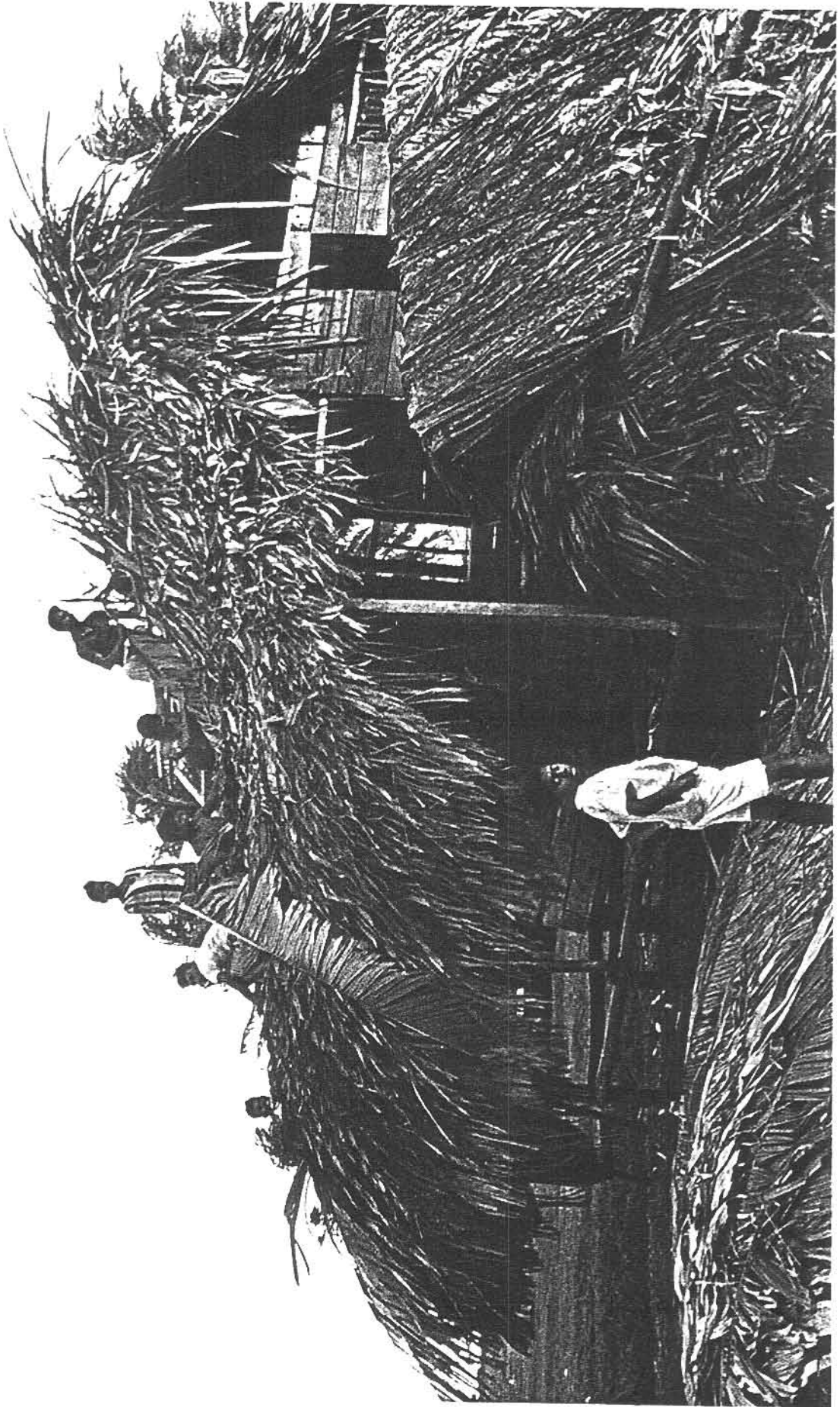

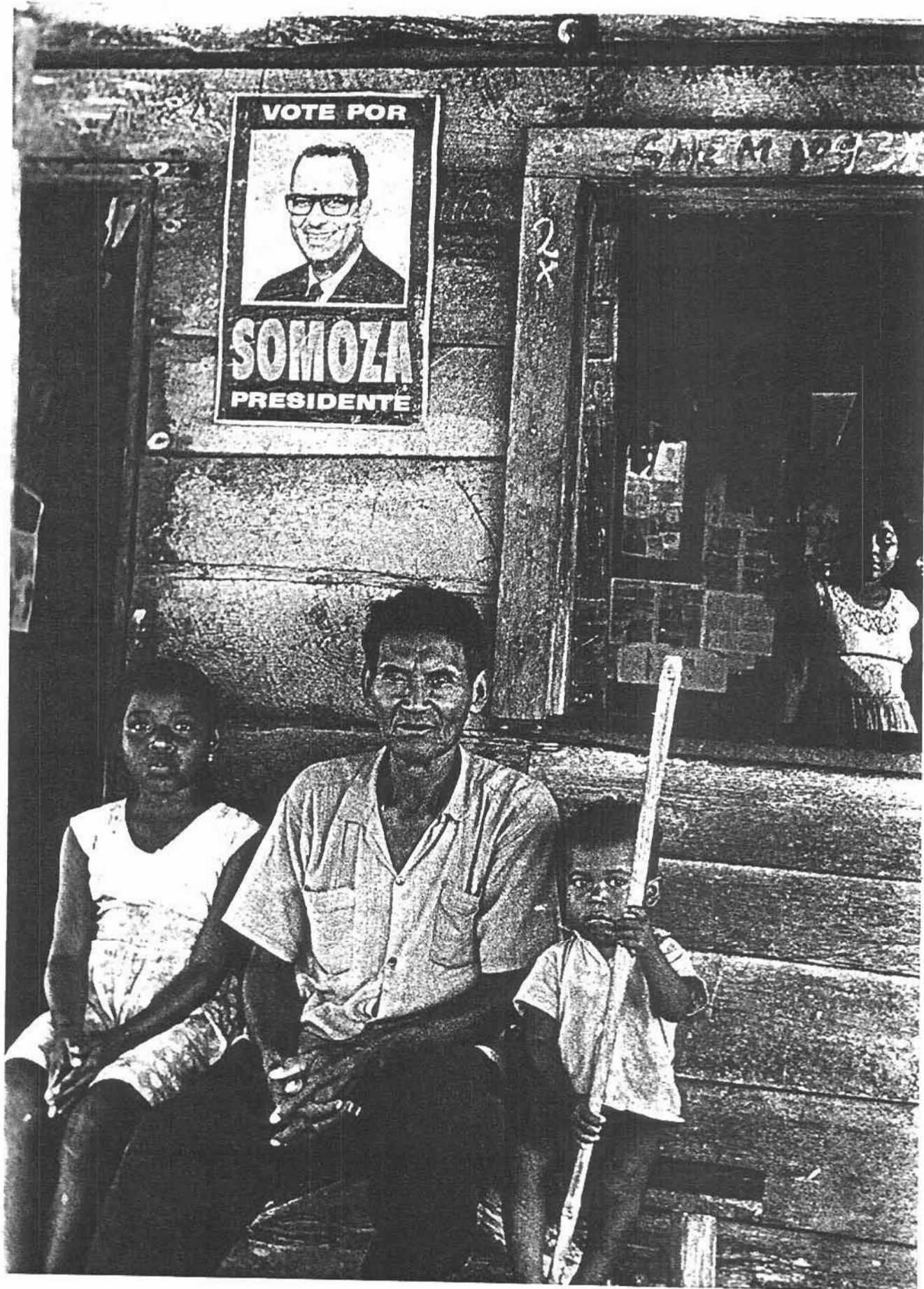
Making wabul, a porridge of bananas and coconut cream, Asang,
